Once I had completed my A levels in Maths, Chemistry, Biology and General studies I had decided that university wasn't for me. After working for several years I spent 4 months travelling and in July 2012 I returned and started working for Edmund Carr in the accounts and audit department.

Shortly after joining I also began the AAT course on day release, starting with level 3 and progressing on to level 4 the following year. Each level has 6 exams covering a variety of different topics in accountancy from accounts preparation to taxation and there is plenty of support during your studies, both from Edmund Carr and the training providers.
